MAKING BRICKS

FOCUS

The Israelites were slaves and made bricks for the Egyptians!

MATERIALS

Play-doh or clay Sticks

ACTIVITY

IN SLAVERY

TALK: The Israelites had lived in Egypt for a long time, and the Egyptians decided to make them slaves. They made bricks to build buildings and worked in the fields!

ACTIVITY: Today let's read Exodus 1:11-14 and have your Tiny Arrow either make bricks out of play-doh or clay and build a small house, or have them do some yard work, like pick up sticks!

So they put slave masters over them to oppress them with forced labor, and they built Pithom and Rameses as store cities for Pharaoh. But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and spread; so the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites and worked them ruthlessly. They made their lives bitter with harsh labor in brick and mortar and with all kinds of work in the fields; in all their harsh labor the Egyptians worked them ruthlessly.

FOCUS

God told Moses to go to Pharaoh and ask him to let His people go!

MATERIALS

Moses & Aaron ask Pharaoh coloring page Crayons

ACTIVITY

PHARAOH SAID NO!

TALK: God asked Moses to go to Pharaoh to let his people go! So after Moses talked to God through a burning bush he and his brother Aaron asked Pharaoh to let God's people go, and Pharaoh said no!

ACTIVITY: Today let's read Exodus 3:7-10 and 5:1-2 and color the coloring page!



The Lord said, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians and to bring them up out of that land into a good and spacious land, a land flowing with milk and honey—the home of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites. And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."



THE 10 PLAGUES



PASSOVER

FOCUS

The Israelites left after Passover and got gold, silver and clothing from the Egyptians!

MATERIALS

Gold, silver or something similar T-shirt

ACTIVITY

GOLD

CORRESPONDING VERSE

TALK: On the night of Passover, the Israelites left Egypt! They were leaving slavery behind! Not only did they get to leave, but the Egyptians gave them their gold, silver and clothing before they left!

ACTIVITY: Today let's read Genesis 12:33-36 and give your Tiny Arrow some gold, silver (or something similar to represent them) and a t-shirt and explain how the Egyptians gave them lots of things before the Israelites left, then let them take a walk outside in the backyard or somewhere similar.

The Egyptians urged the people to hurry and leave the country. "For otherwise," they said, "we will all die!" So the people took their dough before the yeast was added, and carried it on their shoulders in kneading troughs wrapped in clothing. The Israelites did as Moses instructed and asked the Egyptians for articles of silver and gold and for clothing. The Lord had made the Egyptians favorably disposed toward the people, and they gave them what they asked for; so they plundered the Egyptians.
