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THE TONGUE

FOCUS

PROVERBS 15:1, 16:24, & 18:21, MATTHEW 15:18, EPHESIANS 4:29, COLOSSIANS 3:6, HEBREWS 3:13 & JAMES 3:5 & 3:10

Our words are powerful! They can bring life and death!

MATERIALS

The Tongue picture

Cardboard person with words

Twizzler Pull and Peel and graph (1 per child)

Bucket of water with a stick to stir

Jenga

2 water bottles and clear (water) and black food coloring

Encourage coloring page

Crayons

ACTIVITIES

1. INTRODUCTION

TALK: Ask the children if they know about the tongue and the power of our words!

ACTIVITY: Show children The Tongue picture and hang nearby for them to see.



CORRESPONDING VERSE

2. WHERE WORDS COME FROM

TALK: Our words come out of our hearts!

ACTIVITY: Have children take turns reaching into the mouth of the cardboard person and pulling out a word from the bag where the heart is.

BUT THE THINGS THAT COME OUT OF A PERSON'S MOUTH COME FROM THE HEART, AND THESE DEFILE THEM.

ACTIVITIES

3. BAD WORDS


TALK: There are some feelings and actions that we should get rid of! Anger is when we are very mad, rage is when we are so mad we cannot control ourselves, malice is when we want to do something wrong, slander is when we lie about someone, filthy language is when we say words that are ugly and disobedience is if we are not obeying!

ACTIVITY: Have the children take the papers with the bad words and throw them in the trash.

4. OUR TONGUES

TALK: Our tongues are small, but they can say big things!

ACTIVITY: Have everyone measure the size of the tongue using a pull in peel. Then see who can shout the loudest. Make a graph of who shouted the loudest and whose tongue was the biggest.

5 CALM & STIRRED UP

TALK: Answering someone with kind, gentle words is better then using mean words!

ACTIVITY: Grab a large container filled with water. Then put a stick inside to stir it. Have each child say something gentle and see how it is calm. Then say something mean, and stir the water to show them how it gets rough.

6 BUILD UP & TEAR DOWN

TALK: When we say mean things it is like we are taking away from someone, but when we say kind things, we are building them up!

ACTIVITY: Set up a jenga game, then have the children take away a block and add it to another pile beside it. Have each child participate until the first pile collapses and the second is built up.

ACTIVITIES

7. LIFE & DEATH

TALK: We have the power of life and death with our tongue! What we say matters!

ACTIVITY: Add clear water to a bottle as you say nice things. Then add black food coloring to another bottle as you say mean things.

8. TAME THE TONGUE

TALK: We need self control to tame our tongue! We need to be able to stop ourselves from doing or saying things we should not do!

ACTIVITY: Choose a word, like pineapple, that you are going to have each child "tame their tongue" to not say. Have them say the word, then have them repeat the word again but this time hold their tongue with their fingers so it is hard to say.

9. KINDNESS IS SWEET

TALK: When we say kind words, is it sweet like honey!

ACTIVITY: Encourage each child to say something nice, and give them some honey to eat afterwards.

10. ENCOURAGE

TALK: We should use our tongues to encourage each other every day!

ACTIVITY: Add the encouraging words to the cardboard person before this activity. Have each child grab an encouraging phrase from the cardboard person, then have them say it to someone in the room.
